## BY-LAWS.

- 1. The officers of this associa tion shall be a president, a vice president, a secretary, a treasurer and an executive committee of five members, of which execu tive committee the president and secretary shall be "ex officio" members.
- 2. Officers shall be elected at the annual meeting held on the third Monday in February of each year, and shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.
