PROF. H. L. BOLLEY. Botanist of the Government Experiment Station at Fargo, N. D.

WHEAT SMUT. Mix one pound of 40 per cent. Formalply this to the seed grain in any manner that will moisten all the grain over all the surface.

OAT AND

Use same mixture as for wheat, but more care should be used to see that BARLEY SMUT. grain is wet enough to soak through the chaff.

FLAX SICK SOIL Flax does not exhaust the land. A parasitic fungus is found on the seed or FLAX WILT.

parastic fungus is found on the seed and if planted without treatment will spoil the land for Flax. You can't get the fungus out of the soil, same solution as for wheat. Use the spray and shovel method. A small force pump set to throw a fine spray gives the best result. Apply about one-half gallon of solution per bushel.

POTATO SCAB Use same mixture as above. Soak whole potatoes for two hours before cut.
