A republican campaign button on the face of which is a picture of the original Roosevelt cabin is being circulated. In the fall of 1883 Theodore

Roosevelt visited western North Dakota for his health, became enraptured with the country, bought the "Maltese Cross" brand of cattle and ordered built the cabin now shown in the North Dakota exhibit in the Agricultural Building, World's Fair.

The cabin stood eight miles south of Medora (on the line of the Northern Pacific Railroad) in the heart of a romantic region abounding in big game. Here Mr. Roosevelt lived for three years, dividing his time between hunting and the actual life of the cowboy, and here he regained health and acquired the strength which has tilted him for the arduous duties which have since been his.

The cabin was purchased by the state of North Dakota, taken down early last March, and re-built on its present site exactly as it stood on the banks of the Little Missouri river.

The articles shown in the cabin were actually worn or used by Theodore Roosevelt and have been loaned by his late foreman, who is now the owner of the "Maltese Cross" brand of cattle.

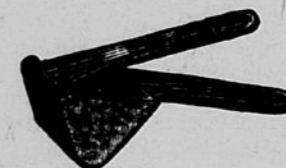

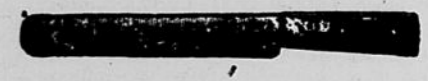

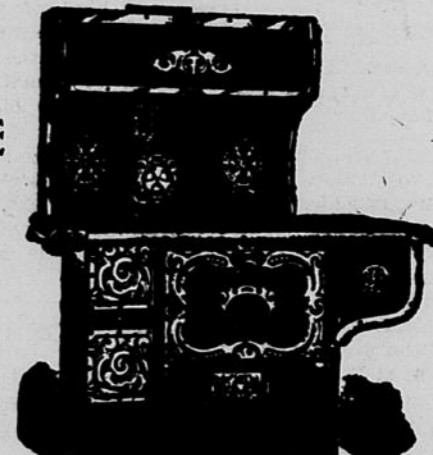
