Here Mr. Roosevelt lived for three years, dividing his time between hunting and the actual life of the cowboy, and here he regained health and acquired the strength which has fitted him for the arduous duties which have since

The cabin was purchased by the state of North Dakota, taken down early last March, and re built on its present site exactly four feet and renovated all over gen- as it stood on the banks of the Little Missouri river.


