This is as pretty an array of statesmen as ever steered a candidate or packed a convention, and yet it appears to be the custodian of the convictions and fortunes of the seer of Esopus, who is summoned weekly to New York to receive his instructions.

Whatever evil or menace there may be in trusts and combinations of capital, the people will take notice that the Republican party is the only one that has attempted to break up illegal combinations of capital. SLAPS THE BRYANITES

Cleveland Says Democracy Has Now Returned to Sanity.

Bryanites seem justified in declining to affiliate with the Parker-Cleveland party. While Mr. Cleveland is not the Democratic candidate, he is the greatest gun in the party. What he says is a sure indication of the sentiments of eastern Democrats—and they are now firmly in the saddle. Mr. Cleveland solemnly rejoices over the defeat of Bryanism at St. Louis. When asked by a correspondent what he thought of Judge Parker's gold telegram and the action of the convention following its receipt, Mr. Cleveland rose slowly and, after a brief silence, said:

"The party's action speaks for itself. It has returned to sanity and future progress along the right lines now is assured. Yes, it speaks for itself. The welfare of the Democratic party is close to my heart, and it is once more upon the right road."

"No other administration in our history, no other government in the world, has more consistently stood for the broadest spirit of brotherhood in our common humanity, or has held a more resolute attitude of protest against every wrong that outraged the civilization of age, at home or abroad."—Roosevelt's Letter of Acceptance.

Democratic Contract.

Contractorism would be a better name than Democrat for the party that favors anti-expansion. Favoring free silver, which meant the contraction of money and its purchasing power; the hauling down of the stars and stripes in Hawaii, the Philippines and other acquired territory is contraction of territory; advocating curtailment of appropriations by congress means, if carried out, the contraction of rural free mail delivery, and of all other internal works and improvements. The revision of the tariff as favored by the Democratic platform means contraction of the demand for labor, contraction of money in circulation, contraction of values, and contraction of our belts to make our stomachs fit the contracted supply of foodstuffs which experience has taught we must get along with under contracted Democratic administration.

A Word to Partisan Democrats.

Republican prosperity is not a vague, meaningless platitude. It is not something that may be good for the other fellow and not good for you. If you would be willing to deny yourself Republican prosperity for the sake of being a hide-bound partisan Democrat, you ought nevertheless to ask yourself whether you have a good moral right to vote to deprive others of it.
