The following proposed amendment to the Constitution of North Dakota, having passed the Eight. Legislative Assembly, will be submitted to the Ninth Legislative Assembly for approval or rejection:

That section 163 of the Constitution

proval or rejection:
That section 162 of the Constitution
of the State of North Dakota be
emended so as to read as follows:

§ 162. The moneys of the permanent school fund, and other educational funds, shall be invested only
in bonds of school corporation, or of in bonds of school corporation, or of counties or townships within the state, bonds of the state of North Dakota, municipal bonds, or on first mortgages on farm lands in the state, not exceeding in amount one third of the actual value of any subdivision on which the same may be loaned, such value to be determined by the board of appraisal of school lands.
