The smoke soon filled the building and attracted the attention of those in charge. Sheriff Flynn was away at the time and Deputy Nels P. Nelson was down town. The prisoner had armed himself with a hammer and threatened to lay out any one who went into the cell. When Mr. Nelson arrived he promptly took the hammer away from the prisoner and ordered him into the steel cage and locked him up, the fire being put out in the meantime. 
