Rigid enforcement of Chicago's anti-spitting ordinance which renders those who expectorate on sidewalks, in public conveyances or in public places liable to arrest and fine, led to more than fifty arrests today in the retail business district. Among those arrested were several business men from other cities. Business men, clerks, workingmen and messenger boys, hurrying along, were halted, placed under arrest and locked in jail. 
