We are on our way from Kingston, Jamaica to San Diego, Cuba, on this steamer which is most admirably conducted, and all on board agree that nothing can beat the Dutch (or rather the German.) We all recommend the Hamberg American Line.

We have visited St. Thomas, Porto Rico, Martinique, Barbador, Trinidad, Venezuela (when at Caracas we were given a reception by Castro and one by our Mr. Bowen) Caracas and Jamaica, and we almost unanimously decided that the last is the best of all. The island is one mass of green. We found there all the fruits and other products found at the other islands and some not seen before. The whole island appears prosperous. They raise bigger and better fruit than elsewhere and they raise the price of everything on the island when they see a bunch of 200 American suckers like these about to land. They admit that the Americans are "easier" than any other visitors they have.

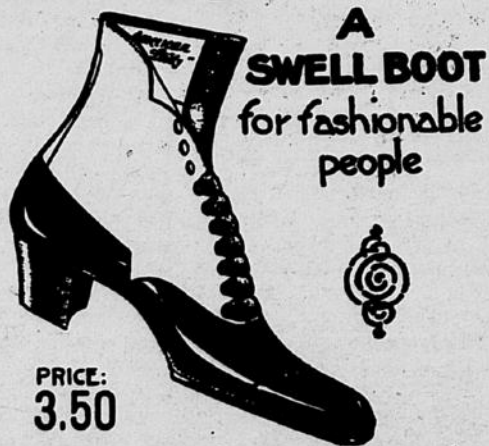
