Section 1. That chapter 96 o. the laws of 1903 (being an amend ment of section 1572 of the re vised codes) be land the same is hereby amended so as to read as town.

Sec. 1572. Notice of taking up estrays.) Each person taking up an estray horse, mare colt, ass mule or meat cattle, sheep, hog or goat, shall within ten days thereafter give notice of the \$50. Binford. finding and taking up of the said animal in a weekly newspaper, if there is such a newspaper published in the county, if not, in the nearest newspaper, which advertisement shall give description of such estray and the marks and brands thereon. Any person taking up such estray shall also file, within ten days, with the county auditor of the county wherein such estray is take up, a description of such estray and the marks and brands thereon. Such persons shall al of taking up such estray mail to the commissioner of agriculture and labor, at his office in Bis. operation. marck, by registered mail, a true copy of the notice hereinbefore counties. The receipt for the made a record second to none. registered letter and proof of publication of the notice as herein provided must be filed with the county auditor of the county where such estray was taken up before said estray can be appraised or before said appraisers can be appointed.
