Taking up Estrays.

Section 1. That chapter 96 of the laws of 1903 (being an amendment of section 1572 of the revised codes) be (and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 1572. Notice of taking up estrays.) Each person taking up an estray horse, mare colt, ass mule or meat cattle, sheep, hog or goat, shall within ten days thereafter give notice of the finding and taking up of the said animal in a weekly newspaper, if there is such a newspaper published in the county, if not, in the nearest newspaper, which advertisement shall give description of such estray and the marks and brands thereon. Any person taking up such estray shall also file, within ten days, with the county auditor of the county wherein such estray is taken up, a description of such estray and the marks and brands thereon. Such persons shall also within ten days from the time of taking up such estray mail to the commissioner of agriculture and labor, at his office in Bismarck, by registered mail, a true copy of the notice hereinbefore required to be given to the county auditor of the respective counties. The receipt for the registered letter and proof of publication of the notice as herein provided must be filed with the county auditor of the county where such estray was taken up before said estray can be appraised or before said appraisers can be appointed. Any person taking up such an estray who fails to advertise such estray or fails to file a description thereof with the county auditor or fails to mail a copy of said notice to the commissioner of agriculture and labor as herein provided, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be liable to the owners of such estray for damages caused by neglecting to advertise as provided.
