NOTICE OF SALE.

SUPREME COURT, NIAGARA COUNTY.
In the Matter of the Application of the Directors of the By-Products Paper Company for the Voluntary Dissolution of the Corporation.

In pursuance of a decree of sale duly granted by this court and entered in the Niagara County Clerk's Office on the 13th day of May, 1905, I, the undersigned, the Temporary Receiver of the By-Products Paper Company, duly appointed in this proceeding for such purpose, will expose for sale, and sell at public auction to the highest bidder therefor, at the office of the Sheriff of the County of Niagara, in the City of Lockport, in said County of Niagara, in the State of New York, on the 13th day of June, 1905, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of that day, all of the property including all of its rights, privileges and franchises, of any name and nature, of the said By-Products Paper Company as directed in, and by said decree to be sold, the said property being described in the petition upon which said decree was granted as follows, to-wit:-

The property of the said By-Products Paper Company consists of two and three story brick buildings, constructed upon premises leased by the said By-Products Paper Company to a New York State corporation, to the French-Hickman Flax Fibre Company, Ltd., a British corporation, which said last mentioned corporation duly assigned said Lease, which is dated September 1, 1899, unto the said By-Products Paper Company, a corporation of the State of New York, by an instrument in writing dated May 28th, 1905, which said instrument are bounded and described as follows:-

All that certain lot, piece or parcel of land situated in the City of Niagara Falls, County of Niagara, and State of New York:- In the blocks numbered five (5) and seven (7), as shown upon a certain lithograph map of the lands of the Niagara Falls Power Company, dated January 1, 1884, a certain parcel hereinafter designated "A, leased," more particularly described as follows:-
