or six years on the same land. Experience has shown that especially on worn land it is better to have an interval of the duration referred to between the crops. Second, the aim should be to sow it if possible on overturned sod. This, however, is not a necessity providing the land is kept in good condition and clean, Third, it is very important indeed that the seed should be thoroughly clean.
