But a more formidable devil, with great horns and possessed of superior powers, makes his appearance and takes the field, whereupon a saint of an incarnation of Buddha himself goes to the rescue, sprays flour on the enemy, makes mystic signs and utters incantations. The skeleton ghosts and the big fiend grovel before utters incantations. him and implore mercy. He graciously yields to their supplications and allows them to partake of a sacramental meal, While they kneel before him he gives to each one of them a little flour to eat and a drink out of a vessel of holy water.
