Motion was made, seconded and carried that a road tax of six mills on each dollar of valuation be levied on the real and personal property in the 2nd district.

On motion Otto Pritz was appointed a Justice of the Peace for the township of Addie.

On motion carried Olaf Quam was appointed a constable for the township of Addie.

On motion it was ordered that \$12.74 be refunded to David Bartlett the amount having been paid in error as taxes for 1904, on the north east 1/4 sec. 20-144-60.

On motion it was ordered that, whereas the south west 1/4 of north west 1/4 and lots 4 and 5 township 147 range 58 was sold to L. M. Abbott Dec. 3rd 1901 for taxes for year 1900, and the said land not being assessable in 1900; the amount of the sale together with 7 per cent interest to date be refunded to the said L. M. Abbott on surrender of the certificate of sale, or the filing of a satisfactory bond to protect the county in case the certificate cannot be produced.

July 6th 1905
Relating to the review and equalization of the assessments.
Board met pursuant to adjournment. All members present, and being in regular session, the board proceeded according to law, as a board of equalization, to review and equalize the assessments of the county and continued as such during the forenoon session.

A motion was made, that for the purpose of making the assessments fair and equal, the following changes be made in the real estate assessments, as left by the boards of Supervisors of the several townships, to-wit:

Broadview raised 15 per cent., Sverdrup raised 7 per cent., Washburn raised 2 per cent., Romness raised 10 per cent., Lenora raised 8 per cent., Greenfield lowered 15 per cent., Tyrol raised 12 per cent., Pilot Mound raised 8 per cent., Bartley raised three per cent., Dover raised 8 per cent., Mabel raised 10 per cent., Bryan raised 10 per cent. Motion seconded and carried unanimously.
