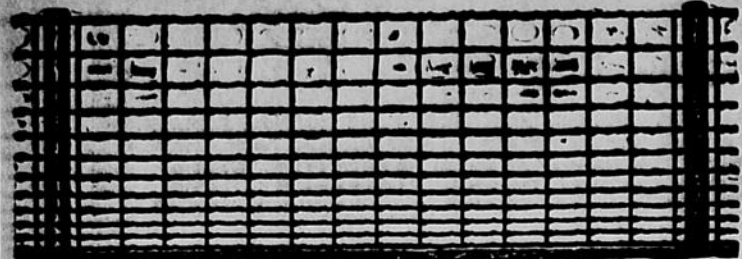

Twp. 145, Rg. 58, 80 acres value \$200. On motion board adjourned until 7 o'clock p. m. July 7th.

Board met pursuant to adjournment and continued with the business of equalizing the assessments.

A motion was made, seconded and unanimously carried; that for the purpose of making the assessments fair and equal throughout the county the following changes be made in the valuations of structures as returned by the boards of supervisors of the several townships, to-wit:

- Dover township, structures all raised 25 per cent.
- Greenfield township, structures of J. H. Mulroy raised to \$800.
- W. C. Langdon raised to \$800.
- Village of Hannaford and additions, raised 50 per cent.
- All others raised 10 per cent.
- Bald Hill township, structures all raised 40 per cent.
- Romness township, structures all raised 20 per cent.
- Addie township, structures, Binford and additions, lowered 25 per cent.
- All others lowered 10 per cent.
- Broadview township, structures all raised 10 per cent.
- 2nd Dist. township, structures all raised 20 per cent.
- Tyrol township, structures, village of Jessie raised 50 per cent.
- Mabel township, structures all raised 20 per cent.
- Washburn township, structures all raised 10 per cent.
- Lenora township, structures all raised 15 per cent.
- Helena township, structures all raised 15 per cent.
- Bryan township, structures, Lewis townsite raised 100 per cent.
- All others raised 50 per cent.

On motion the following property was added to the assessment roll against John Horn of Lenora township:

- 9 horses 3 years, value \$295.
 - 1 herd of cattle 1 year, value \$7.
 - 2 " " " " " " \$22.
 - 2 hogs, value \$6.
 - 2 wagons, value \$51.
 - Implements, value \$20.
 - Total valuation \$402.
- Omitted by assessor in error. This completed the work of the board of equalization.
- On motion board adjourned until 8:30 a. m. July 8th, 1905.
- July 8th--
Board met pursuant to adjournment. All members present.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that W. T. McCulloch, Nicolai Swenson and J. L. Houghton be appointed a board of drainage commissioners for Griggs county, and that the amount of the bond of each member of the commission be fixed at \$500.

It was moved, seconded and carried that Commissioner Lucken be appointed to confer with the board of supervisors of Cooperstown township in regard to repairing the road which begins at the north end of 9th St. village of Cooperstown and runs north on or near the quarter line of sections 24 and 31, and if the township officers refuse to have the necessary repairs made to said road then Mr. Lucken is authorized to proceed to have the work done in behalf of the county, the cost to be charged against the road fund of said township of Cooperstown.

Two petitions were presented to the board asking for the establishment of public scales in the village of Cooperstown.

On motion these petitions were laid over until the October meeting.

The clerk of district court having presented an official request for the names of 40 men qualified to act as jurors to fill up his list as required by law, a motion was made, seconded and carried that the following apportionment of jurors be made:

- Bartley 3, Tyrol 2, Willow 3, Addie 3, Mabel 4, Lenora 1, Greenfield 4, Sverdrup 2, Cooperstown 5, Pilot Mound 1, Romness 1, Village of Cooperstown 4, Washburn 3, Clearfield 2, Rosendal 1, Broadview 4, Bryan 1, 2nd District K. H. Olson and Wm. A. Amos.

A motion was made that the following preamble and resolutions be adopted:

And whereas certain fees are paid into the county treasury for the benefit of the general fund which will reduce the amount to be raised by taxation to that extent, therefore be it resolved by the board of county commissioners of Griggs county, state of North Dakota, that the following taxes be levied upon all the real and personal property assessed in the year 1905 in the county of Griggs and state of North Dakota, to-wit:

- For general purposes \$15000 00
 - For roads and bridges 2500 00
 - For interest on bonds 1500 00
 - For sinking fund 1500 00
- And be it further resolved that there be levied a tax of 2 mills on each and every dollar of valuation on all the taxable property in the county except in incorporated cities and villages for a county road fund as provided by Sec. 1081 Revised Codes of 1899 as amended and approved March 10, 1903.

Motion was seconded and carried, all members voting aye.

The county surveyor filed his report of proposed road grading between Secs. 26 and 35, town of Rosendal, and the county auditor was, by motion, directed to advertise for bids for the grading, and O. S. Gunderson was appointed to receive the bids and award the contract.

Motion was made and carried instructing the county auditor to advertise for bids for grading road between Secs. 7 and 12, Twp. 147, Rgs. 59 and 60, and appointing Commissioner Johnson to receive the bids and award the contract.

Motion was made and carried instructing the county auditor to advertise for bids for grading roads at Lucet's slough, on town line between Secs. 1 and 6 and 12 and 7, 146-60-61; and between Secs. 1 and 12-146-61 and 6 and 7-

146-60; and in the same motion Commissioner Gunderson was authorized to receive the bids and award the contracts. On motion the following bills were allowed:

Motion seconded and carried. Commissioners Nelson and Johnson voting aye. Hadlock, No. Gunderson absent. On motion made, seconded and carried the county treasurer was instructed to withdraw the \$3000 which was deposited in the Hannaford State Bank on time certificate, and distribute the amount equally, as time deposits, among the county depositories.

The bond of the Minneapolis Bridge & Iron Co. in the sum of \$1566 covering their contract with the county, received and approved.

On motion board adjourned until July 25th, 1905, at 2 o'clock p. m.
