"The following are the grades and warehouse commission in measured bushel. compliance with the laws of 1905 of the state of Wisconsin creating a grain and warehouse commission for said state and providing for licensing and regulating warehouses and elevators for the storage and inspection of grain in the city of Superior and be I white oats, dry, sweet, reapoints in said state.

"These rules are to be in full force and effect on and after measured bushel. August 2, 1905."

For State of New York. No. 1 Hard North Dakota spring wheat shall be sound dry, bright and well cleaned spring wheat, composed mostly of hard Scotch varieties, and shall test not less than 58 pounds per measured bushel.

No. 1 Northern Dakot wheat shall be sound, dry and well cleaned, composed mostly of hard varieties of northern grown spring wheat, and test not less than 57 pounds per measured bushel.

No. 2 Northern Dakota spring wheat not fit for a higher grade in consequence of being composed mostly of hard varieties of northern grown spring wheat and test not less than 55 pounds to the measured bushel.

No. 3 spring wheat shall be composed mostly of hard varieties of spring wheat, that are shrunken or for any cause not; fit for higher grade, and test not less than 53 pounds per measured bushel.

No. 4 spring wheat shall be composed of spring wheat no fit for higher grade in connse quence of being of poor quality shrunken, damp or slightly musty, and test not less than 49 pounds per measured bushel. Rejected spring wheat shall include all spring wheat grown, badly bleached or for any cause not fit for No. 4.

No. 1 Durum wheat shall be bright, dry, sound and well cleaned, composed of wheat commonly known as macaroni.

No. 2 Durum wheat shall be sound, dry, reasonably clean. may be slightly bleached or shrunken, not good enough for

No. 3 Durum wheat shall include ail wheat badly bleached, shrunken or smutty, not good enought for a higher grade.


