Tuesday Fairbanks, Morse Co.'s representative came along and examined the scale at the state elevator. He found that the scale had sagged on one corner, and would bind. At this point it required 50 pounds to move the scale. If a load of grain was drawn onto the scale and the weights put on afterwards, the load would weigh 50 pounds more than it should. By testing the weights he found three of them incorrect, some too heavy and some too light. The Fairbank, Morse Co. representative had the scales repaired and put in first-class condition before he left. The state inspector did not discover anything wrong with either the scales or weights and passed them as correct.
