## Hoosier Law Yold.

In the case of the state against John Schott, charged with violation of the automobile law, Judge Vaughn, of Bluffton, Ind., held that the new law is void for the reason that one section of it reads "to the discretion of the jury" to determine what shall constitute a reasonable time to comply with the precautions prescribed by law: After, stating explicitly what the motorist shall do in case of meeting a rig, the law tries to say what the owner of the machine shall do when overtaking a rig, by stating "when signaled as above prescribed, shall reduce the speed of such motor vehicle, and, before passing, shall allow a rea sonable time for such animal or animals, to be driven to the side of the road." Judge Vaughn held that a reasonable time might be construed as one thing in one court and another in some other court, therefore the law would not be uniformly enforced throughout the state and a man could not be made liable to acquittal in one county for acts that would subject him to conviction in another.

As the North Dakota law is similar to the one quoted above it would seem as if it too would be ineffective.
