A Tough Case Successfully Handled.

A New York telegram of Jan. 25: The most brilliant surgical case yet recorded is an operation recently performed at the Chambers Street hospital. In this case precedent was openly defied and the attending surgeons saved a human life, and performed an operation of a kind that never before had been attended with success. One McElroy was shot, the ball stopping at some point within the abdominal cavity. A consultation was held, and it was determined that death would speedily ensue unless relief was afforded in some manner; and heroic treatment was decided upon. Within twenty-four hours after being shot McElroy was transferred to the operating table. Elaborate precautions were taken to prevent the introduction of disease germs into the wound. An incision was made into the abdominal cavity and the entire intestines gradually taken out. The bullet was found in the last section and taken out. It was found to have penetrated the intestines in several places. The operation lasted two hours. As soon as food could be given properly, McElroy gained strength, and went out of the hospital for the first time on Christmas day, less than two months from the time he was injured, and about a week after he was discharged cured. The success of the operation is considered a great triumph in surgical science.
