**The Farmers' Bill.**

The associated press report of the legislative proceedings of Wednesday says: The committee railroad bill, which embraces the main features of the several railroad bills introduced in the council and the Oliver bill in the house, being the committee substitute for all of them, passed the council by a unanimous vote, and will pass the house when reached. It creates a railroad commission, which shall have a general supervision of railways in their relation to the public; the object being to check and remedy the evils. It provides for an open market, and requires cars to be placed so they may be loaded from sleighs or wagons when demanded, and prohibits discrimination in charges. The commission may determine where side track connections shall be furnished. The bill now goes to the house, and will there be considered in connection with the bill in the house, reported by the committee sent to St Paul for conference with a committee from the Minnesota legislature, that deals particularly with warehouses, elevators and grades, and is in some respects supplementary to the bill passed.
