Something excellent is always found in Major Edwards letters from Bismarck to the Argus; and if we clip liberally from them we hope the genial Major will pardon us. Here is an extract from one of them relative to Councilman Nickens' bill, authorizing a bonus of \$5,000 for the discovery of coal in paying quantities in the territory, and may be of more or less local interest, considering that the Lenham Elevator Company, is drilling a well at this point, and may possibly strike—well they might hit a vein of coal, somewhere between here and China: The Major says: "The bill passed the council without a dissenting voice, and I am glad it was in this way. I understand some of the findings ninety feet below the surface at Colfax were sent to parties in Pennsylvania and pronounced to be of excellent quality. An expert defines it as semi-bituminous, with only seven per cent ash, and said with right management and engineering that coal at a depth of one hundred feet below the surface could be loaded on cars for one dollar a ton, and that for every foot of thickness of vein a yield of ten thousand tons to the acre would be the result. The gentleman who makes this statement is said to have had great experience in drilling and digging for coal in Scotland, and at one time superintended the putting down of a wooden shaft twenty-four hundred feet below the surface, and it proved a success in its supplies and profits. In a private letter just received from the Rev. Mr. Crandall of Colfax, he says: "I believe that the great Architect of the Universe, in the formation of this world, hid away millions of fuel beneath our soil for the purpose of keeping warm the millions that may have homes within the bounds of our extensive and marvelous empire. Our people are too energetic not to hunt hiding places of these deposits, and on behalf of Judge Nickens, Mr. Russell, and others who have taken an interest in this matter, not forgetting yourself, I wish to express my thanks. I hope the legislature will pass the bill." I regard the proposition to offer a bonus for coal one of the most commendable that has received the consideration of the legislature."
