Newspapers of To-Day.

People generally, and those who may be termed steady readers and close observers, have but a faint conception of the magnitude and influence the press of this country has attained. From a careful examination of the advance pages of the 1885 edition of the American Newspaper Directory, issued May 1 by Geo. P. Rowell & Co., of New York. it apears that there are 14,147 newspapers and periodicals published in the United States and Canada; of these the United States has 12,973, an average of one paper for every 3,867 persons. In 1884 the total number of newspapers was less by 823 than at present, and while the gain is not so marked as in some previous years, is still considerable. Kansas shows the greatest increase -the number being 78, while Illinois follows with a gain of 77. It is curious to notice that New York, the scene of so much political activity during the Formerly with last campaign, should have only about one-third as many new papers as the state of Pennsylvania. As an index to the comparative growth and prosperity of different sections of the country, especially the territories, the number of new papers forms an interesting study, and may well occupy the attention of the curious.-Ex.
