### Officers Placed in a False Position by Society Worshipers.

A writer in the New York World declares that the so-called army honor is a myth-there being no higher sense of honor among the army officers as a class than there is among people of equal edacation and position in other occupations of life. I doubt if there is as much. Army officers are placed in a false po-sition through the attention paid them by society. An army officer comes to Washngton and he is invited everywhere, and is called upon to associate with people who have plenty of money. As a natural result he soon becomes involved inancially. A man who feels the sharp pressure of debt cannot always afford the luxury of indulging in the nost rigid ideas of what is strictly nonorable. None of them have any better pay than the department clerks and bureau chiefs. Yet these oficers live at the best hotels as a general thing, have carriages, dress well and tre seen everywhere. The department elerks, who have equal salaries, live in the back rooms of cheap boarding-houses, wear shabby clothes and never go n society. A second lieutenant \$1,400 a year; a first lieutenant, \$1,600. that is if he is mounted. An unmounted first lieutenant gets \$1,500. A captain act mounted is paid \$1,800. A captain mounted has \$2,000. It will be seen that up to the grade of captain officers rank with the department clerks so far as salary goes. When you get above captain you strike the salaries paid to the chiefs of bureaus. A major is paid \$2,500; a lieutenant-colonel, \$3,000; a colonel, \$3,500. It is only when you reach the rank of brigadier-general that the pay of a Senator or member is reached. A brigadier-general is paid \$5,500. A major-general \$7,500, and a lieutenant-general \$11,000 per annum.

### Origin of Masonry.

A writer in a recent number of the Voice of Masonry upon the origin of the order, gives a variety of views held by high authority, but holds that it antedates the Christian era, or is, at least, not Christian in its inception. ### Destroying Horns.


