Glanders.

The prevalence of glanders in St. Paul has caused serious apprehension among horsemen, as the disease is such an extremoly fatal one. Dr. Jones, of the health office, says of the direase:

"In this disease the horse has a capricious appetite, with a tendency to shiver or chill, and perspire easily. There is a discharge of a starchy or gluey material from one or both nostrils occasionally tinged with blood. The mucus membrane in the nostril presents deep pit-like ulcers, as though cut out with a punch, with here and there yellowish pimples which eventually ulcerated. The eye of the horse looks weak and smaller than usual, and often a discharge issues from them. The submaxillary lymphatic glands become hard and swollen, usually presenting a hard knot under the jaw. This hardness and swelling is of a remitting nature, and may either increase or decrease rapidly. This swelling may slowly disappear in a few days, again to reappear rapidly. The mucus membrane of the nostril is paler than in health, or may be a tawny, coppery or leaden hue. There is a form of the disease that affects the lungs of the horse; the animal then has a dry, dull, soft cough Glanders is a malignant, contagious and fatal disease, due to en animal poison, and manifests itself chiefly through the nostrils, lungs and and lymphatic glands of the animal. When once introduced into a stable it is certain to spread amongst the horses there located. A horse exposed to glanders usually manifests the disease it in from two to three days. Glanders is equally dangerous to animals and man, and when the latter contracts it from the horse it proves almost inevitably fatal."
