Beaten by a Steam Yacht,

For more than twenty two years the side wheel steamboat Mary Powell has been recognized as the fastest boat on the Hudson river; she makes an average of twenty miles an hour, and according to a pamphlet issued by the owners, "in the year 1882, she ran at the rate of 26 miles an hour, between Milton and Poughkeepsie, making the four miles in nine minutes." The run was from this city to Sing Sing, a distance of thirty miles, and was made by the steam yacht Stiletto in one hour and fifteen minutes, the Mary Powell, on her regular trip to Rondout; being beaten about two miles. -Scientific American.
