### The Haddock Murder.

STOUX CITY, Iowa, Jan. 17.—A petition has been signed by five Sioux City ministers, asking the governor to appoint special counsel to aid in the prosecution of the Haddock murder case. The petition names L. L. Mills of Chicago, and Judge C. C. Nurse, of Des Moines, as lawyers, either of whom will be satisfactory to the petitioners. A meeting of the attorneys for the prosecution, was held to day, at which it was decided to agree to the request of the petition. The petition also requests the governor to grant immunity to George Trieber, who has for weeks been in communication with attorney Wood. Trieber is a most important witness, and no other man knows more of the secrets of the defense. Trieber was stationed to shoot Dr. Haddock on the night of the murder, and he distributed some of the money to get other conspirators out of the way. He fled to Canada and went thence to New York, spending several weeks there. Two weeks ago he embarked for Hamburg, where he now is, awaiting the result of negotiations. Attorney wood has a letter written by Arnesdorf, to Trieber, since the latter left here. D. W. Wood, the attorney who has figured so conspicuously in the case, was arrested to-day on complaint of Chapman & Co., of Lemars, Plymouth county. Wood was taken to Lemars, where he waived examination and gave bonds in the sum of \$500, returning here this evening. The amount of the alleged larceny is \$57. The case will be brought on for trial soon, but it is not known just what day.

### Logan's Successor.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. Jan. 18.—A joint republican caucus, to choose a successor to John A. Logan for United States senator, met this afternoon. One hundred and ten votes were cast on the first ballot; necessary to a choice, fifty-six. Farwell received thirty-seven; Hamilton, fourteen; Henderson, ten; Payton, twelve; Cannon, eleven; Carr, eight; Raum, seven; Shuman, one; Morrison, one; Medill, one. Chas. B. Farwell, was nominated on the second ballot. Morrison is the nominee for the democrats.

### Day and Wilson.

YANKTON, Jan. 17.—M. H. Day, had a conference with leading democrats here to-day. He is a candidate for auditor. John R. Wilson, candidate for attorney general, left for Bismarck, to-day.

### General Hazen Dead.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—General W. B. Hazen, chief signal officer, United States army, died in this city at eight o'clock this evening. He has been ill since Thursday, last. No danger was apprehended until this afternoon.
