

A convenient and desirable implement for taking up fence posts, says The American Agriculturist, consists of a stout pole of the size and shape of a wagon



A CONVENIENT POST LIFTER.

The thickest part of this pole, for about fifteen inches from the end, is shaped into a wedge. This is sheathed with a frame made of from half an inch thick and two and a half inches wide, and securely fastened with screws or bolts. The end should be pointed and slightly bent upward. The manner of using this convenient implement is shown above in the illustration. illustration.

Directions are also given for setting a gate post so that the gate will never sag and catch on the ground. Sometimes, owing to the soft nature of the soft,

it is almost impos-sible to plant the post firmly by ordinary means. The work may, however, be satis-

factorily accom-plished by pack-ing medium sized engraving. Then if it is thought that this will not firmness, add ////

Do not cover up the stones with earth or
disturb the post for a few days until the
mortar has "set." Remember that the
post must be set p umb while the work is
going on, as it can never be straightened going on, as it can ne, er be straightened after the mortar has "set." Only durable posts should be used, and this rethod of setting should only be followed with gate posts which are supposed to be permanen, and not with posts apt to be changed.

How to Tell if Timber is Sound.
